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# Herpes Zoster Vaccines

#### RZV (Shingrix)

- Stored in the refrigerator
- Requires reconstitution with liquid adjuvant supplied by the manufacturer
- Administered IM
- 2 dose series at 0 & 2-6 months
- Preferential recommendation for those <u>></u> 50 years.



#### **ZVL** (Zostavax)

- Stored in the freezer
- Requires reconstitution with liquid diluent supplied by the manufacturer
- Administered SQ as a single dose
- Recommended for those
   <u>></u> 60 years.



#### VAERS REPORTS

- 155 reports involving Shingrix (RZV) in the first
   4 months of RZV monitoring
  - 13/155 (8%) reports documented administration errors (some reports documented more than one error)
    - 9/13 reports involved RZV being given by SQ route rather than IM
      - 8/9 described injection site reactions of pain, erythema and pruritus
    - 2/13 reports documented inappropriate age (39 & 48)
    - 2/13 received VIS for ZVL and were not instructed to come back for second dose

## VAERS REPORTS (CONT.)

- 13 (8%) reports documented administration errors (some reports documented more than one error)
  - 1/13 reports documented administration of ZVL instead of RZV
  - 1/13 reports documented administration of RZV after incorrect frozen storage
  - 1/13 reports documented the administration of only the adjuvant component without reconstitution with the vaccine antigen

### LESSONS LEARNED

- Shingrix (RZV) has different storage and administration requirements than Zostavax (ZVL).
- Be sure Shingrix (RZV) is:
  - stored in the refrigerator not freezer
  - reconstituted with correctly with adjuvant supplied
  - administered via the IM route
- Always report any adverse events and administration errors to VAERS.
- Ensure patients receiving Shingrix (RZV) are:
  - counseled about the possibility of local site reactions and side effects that could disrupt regular activities for a few days
  - encouraged to still receive their second vaccination dose as recommended

## ERROR REPORTING

- Report all vaccine adverse events to VAERS at vaers.hhs.gov or (800) 822-7967.
- Report vaccine administration errors (e.g., wrong route, wrong dose, and wrong age) to the Institute for Safe Medication Practices (ISMP) via the Vaccine Error Reporting Program (VERP) website <a href="http://ismp.org">http://ismp.org</a>. Vaccine administration errors should also be reported to VAERS (as described above), and MUST be reported if they resulted in an adverse event.
