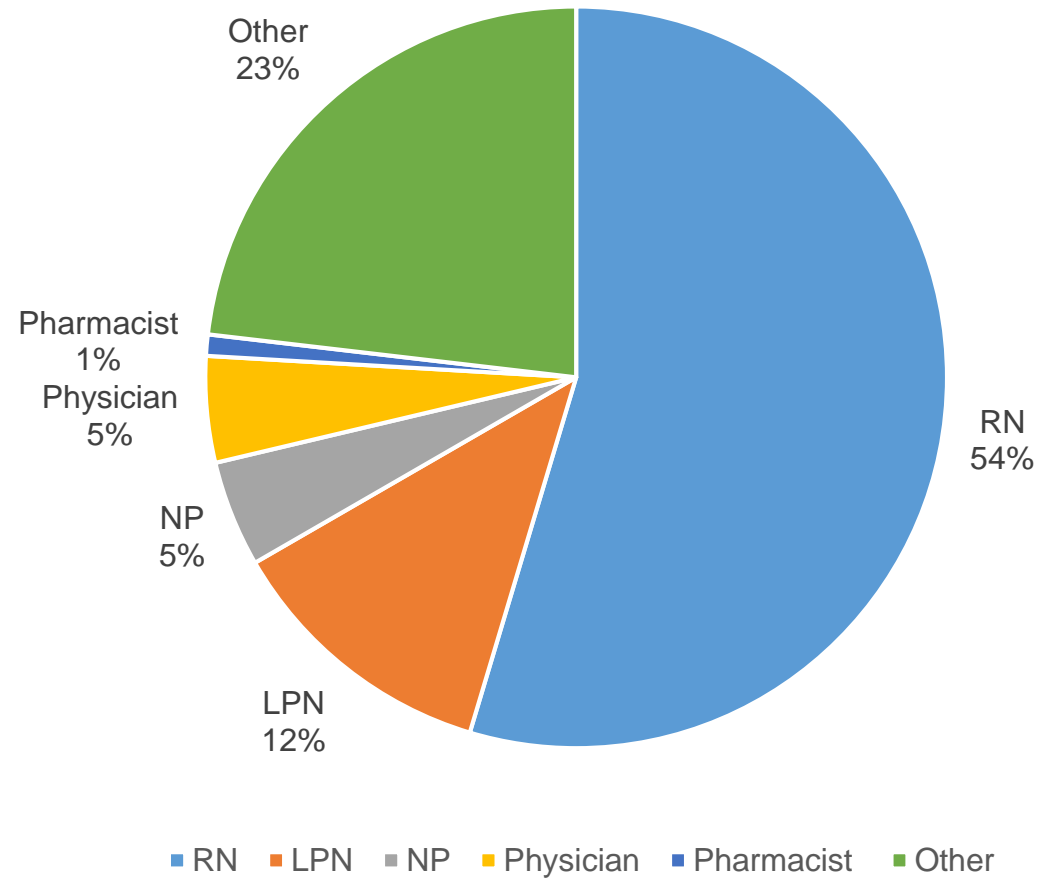

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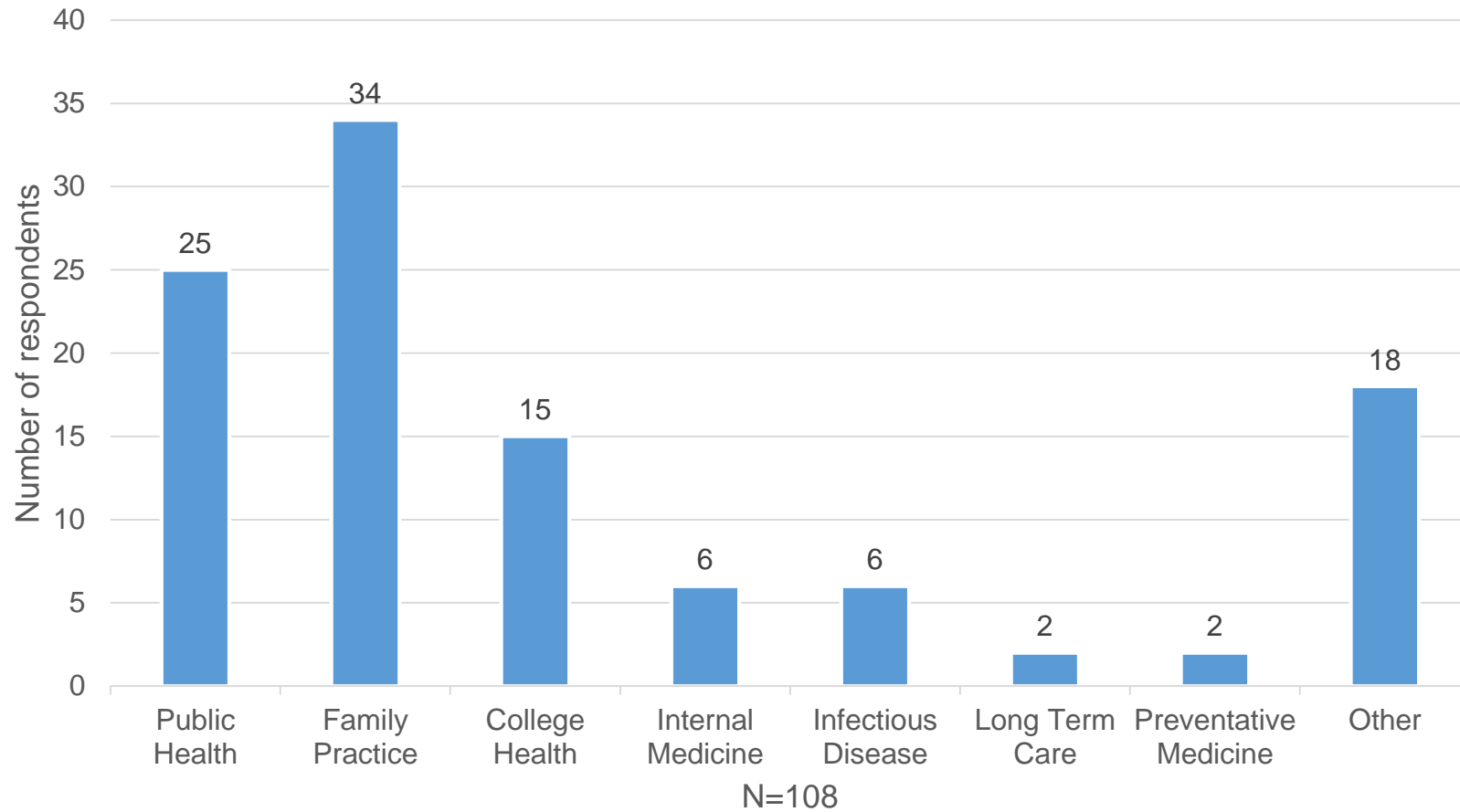
- 108 participants responded to the evaluation

Q1: What is your professional affiliation?

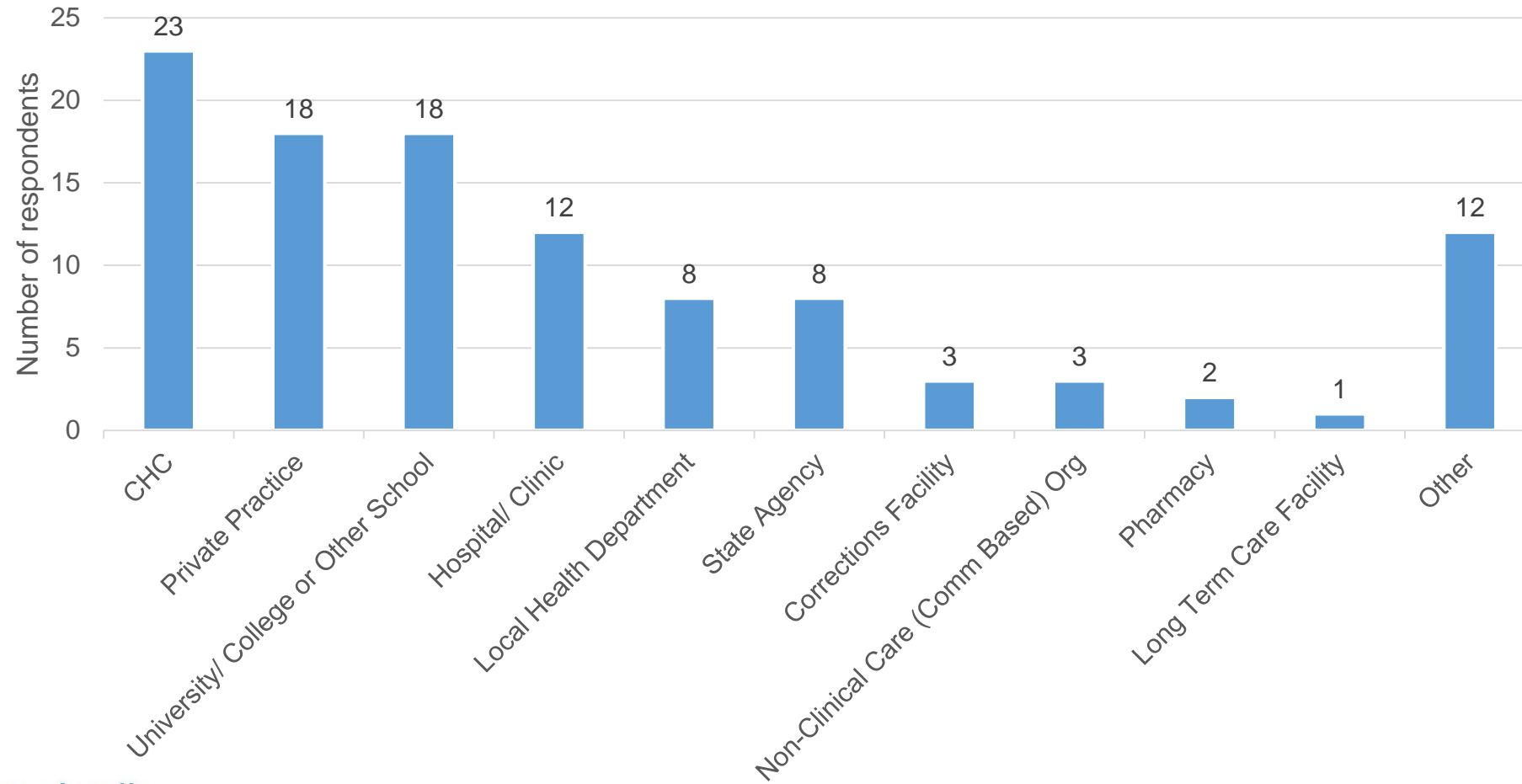

Q3: In what type of organization are you primarily involved?

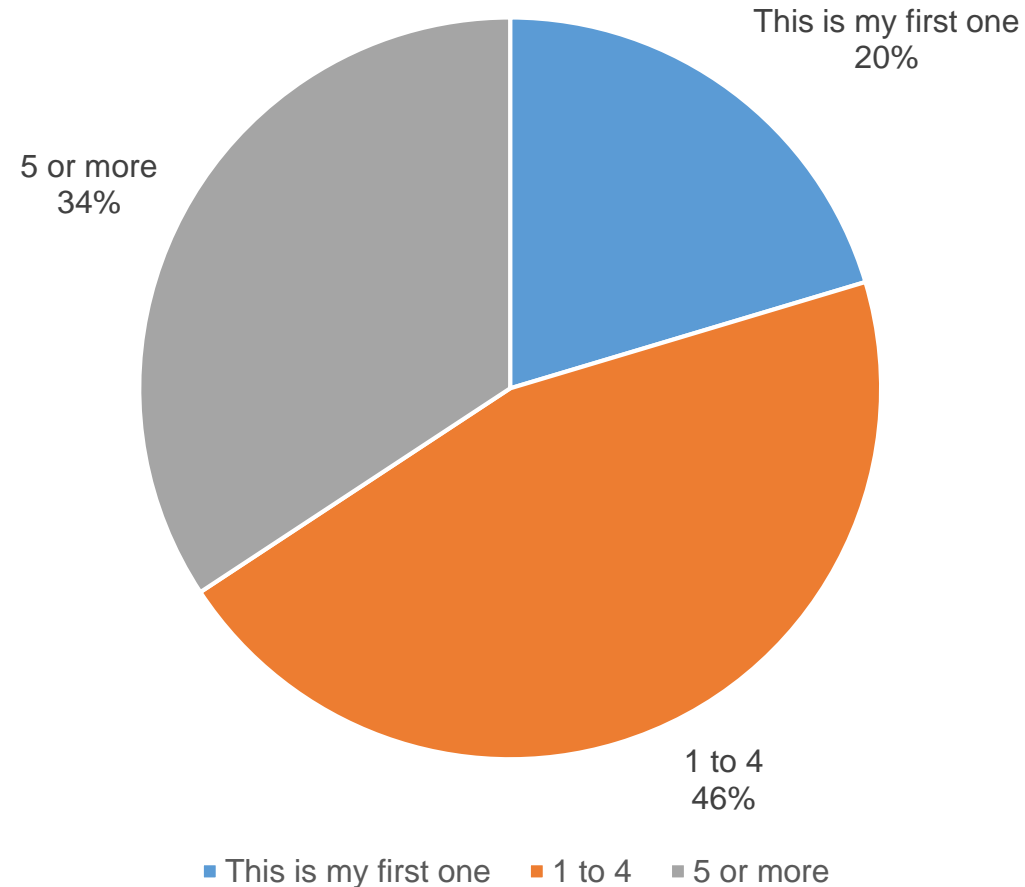


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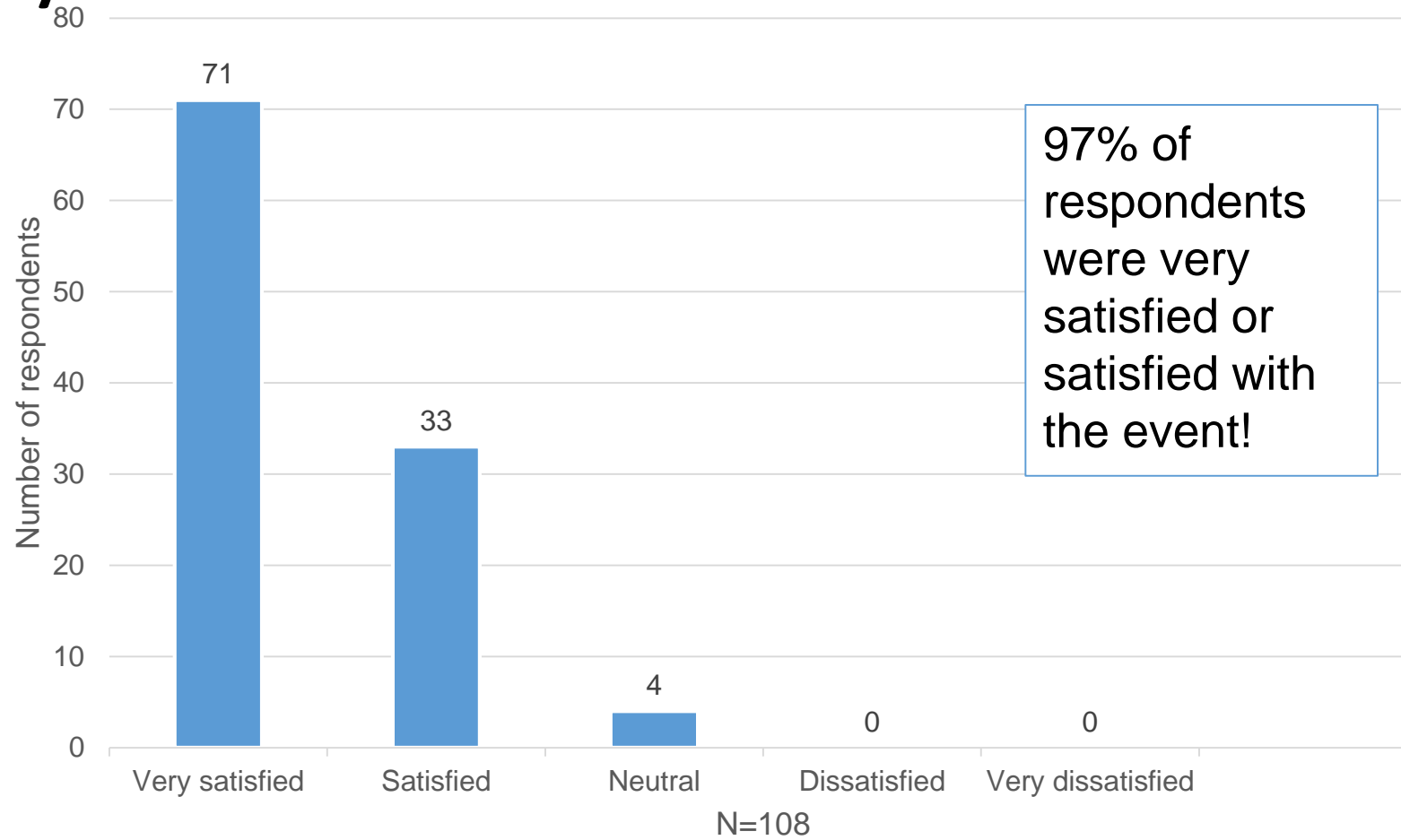
